Voters elect the six (6) members of Council and the Mayor for terms of four (4) years. They serve on a part-time basis and act as the legislative branch of government with the responsibility of formulating City Policy. The Council enacts Ordinances, approves the City Budget, and appoints the City Manager who serves as the Chief Administrative Officer of the City.

The City Manager is a professional trained in Municipal Administration. He is appointed on the basis of ability and is responsible for the day-to-day administration of the City Government. He appoints all department directors, submits the proposed budget to the City Council and enforces all City ordinances.

Troy is served by seven public school districts as well as 11 colleges and universities.
